MIDDLETON CHENEY HEALTH WALKS - These village-based walks are part of the South Northants programme of health walks, with Angela and Roy Clements leading the 1st Friday of the month (longer walks) and the 2nd Monday health walks. They have handed the 4th Monday of the month health walks over to leaders Janet Davies, Paul 'Monty' Montague and Len Wood.



The Monday health walks are intended for those who are not regular walkers or are recovering from illness. They are taken at an easy going pace, 1.5 – 2 miles in length on pavements and generally level footpaths with few stiles and take about an hour to complete.

The Friday walks are longer, 4 -5 miles in length, of about 2 hours duration, taking in slightly more challenging terrain and are designed to develop walkers towards joining one of the numerous walking/rambling groups in the area.

All walks are of a social nature and end with the option of refreshments.

2nd Monday walks: Meet at 10.am nr the Red Lion with the option of refreshments (£1) afterwards at 'Take Thyme' by kind permission.

4th Monday walks: Meet nr the New Inn at 10am with the option of refreshments (£1) afterwards in the Parish Meeting Room.

1st Friday walks: Meet nr the Red Lion with refreshments (£1.50) afterwards at the New Inn

Protect your vehicle from number plate theft

From June 07 to June 08 there were 253 recorded offences of number plate thefts across Northamptonshire West. Number plates can be used as an aid to commit further crime and the following information is designed to ensure your vehicle isn't next.

Consider investing in a secure number plate. `Secureplate` is a theft resistant vehicle number plate independently assessed by Sold Secure* (*Independent security testing organisation). For more details visit www.secureplate.com Alternatively replace the existing screws in your number plate with non-return screws.

HELP AT HAND - GIVE A LIFT TO YOUR LOCAL COMMUNITY

What do we do?

Middleton Cheney volunteer car service is supported by Northants County Council, Our volunteer drivers use their own cars to take people to essential (usually medical related) appointments. Anyone can use the service if they live in Middleton and their mobility problems make it difficult to access public transport.



What does it cost?

There is no registration fee and our service is open to anyone in Middleton Cheney who has a genuine need. Our drivers are volunteers who give their time without being paid. However, passengers pay a mileage charge to help cover the driver's fuel cost. In addition passengers meet the cost of any car parking or congestion charges. Payment is made to the driver at the time of the journey.

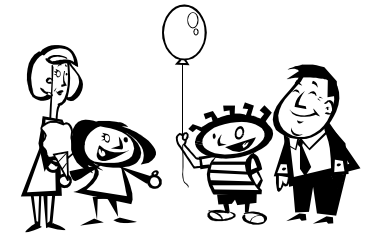

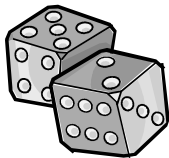


MIDDLETON CHENEY ART GROUP -
