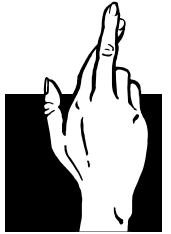

### **ART IN MIDDLETON CHENEY**

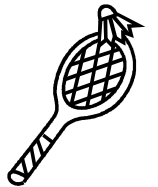

## **CONSULTATION ON NEW LAWS FOR DOG OWNERS**

South Northamptonshire Council is consulting on whether to adopt new powers that apply to all dog owners.

From Monday, 11 August to Tuesday 30 September 2008, there will be a statutory consultation period, which will determine whether there will be NEW LAWS that require dog owners to:

- Clean up when a dog has fouled
- Keep dogs on a lead in some areas
- Keep dogs out of some areas
- Put a dog on a lead by direction.

This is open for members of the public and other interested groups who may wish to comment.

**HALLOWEEN AND BONFIRE NIGHT ARE NOT FAR AWAY:-**

**Keep Yourself safe:**

If you trick or treat, go with friends and don't go into stranger's houses.

**Here's a reminder:**

If you call at someone's door and cause annoyance to them, you commit an offence.

If you throw eggs or flour you may commit a crime

Eggs and flour may be taken off you if the Police think you intend to throw them.

**Before they explode read the code!**

Keep fireworks in a sealed box or tin

Don't give sparklers to children under five

Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them

Light fireworks at arms length using a taper or firework lighter

Buy fireworks that conform to British Standards( BS7114 on the box)

Keep pets indoors

Ensure that all children with firework are well supervised

Don't touch fireworks that have gone off or failed to go off.

If in doubt, attend a public display or seek advice

**Remember, Remember the 5th of November**

It is illegal for anyone under 18 to possess adult fireworks in a public place.

It is illegal to throw or discharge a firework in a street or public place.

It is illegal to let off fireworks between 11pm and 7am (Nov 5th - 12am the following day)

Northamptonshire Police will issue £80 on-the-spot fines to people who misuse fireworks.

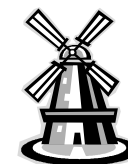


Have you ever wondered exactly how and what goes into producing a show? There were over 45 people involved in our last production and half of those were not performers.
