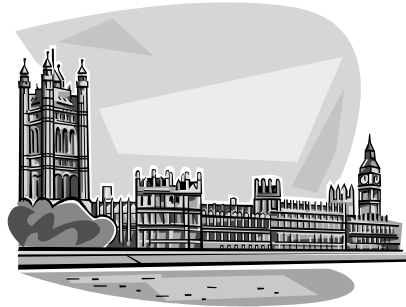


(Councillor Paul Browne took over as Chairman of the Parish Council in June and is supported by Councillor Craig Bryant as Vice Chairman).

A MESSAGE TO THE RESIDENTS OF MIDDLETON CHENEY

I am Andrea Leadsom and I am delighted to be your new **MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT**. It is a great honour to be the first MP for South Northamptonshire - I am really looking forward to the challenge and thank you for giving me the opportunity to represent you. I am also delighted to make a contribution to your newsletter.



It has been a hectic first few months trying to get used to the rules and conventions, getting lost around the Palace of Westminster and hot-desking in committee rooms while I wait for a permanent office to become available.

On Tuesday 22nd June I was able to deliver my Maiden Speech in the House of Commons during the Budget debate. I have made plenty of speeches over the last 10 years but nothing has ever been quite as intimidating as standing up to speak for the first time in the Chamber.

In a very busy week I was also elected by Conservative MPs to the Treasury Select Committee which examines the expenditure, administration and policy of HM Treasury, HM Revenue and Customs public bodies such as the Bank of England and the Financial Services Authority (FSA). At this crucial time for the British economy, the committee has an extremely important job to do, and its reports are well respected by many financial institutions, as well as the Treasury. I am sure I will be far busier now, but I am looking forward to the challenges that lie ahead.

I have really enjoyed the first few months as the new MP for South Northamptonshire. I am committed to protecting and promoting the interests of local people and I hope that, whoever you supported in the election, you will feel able to contact me if you feel I can ever be of any help. 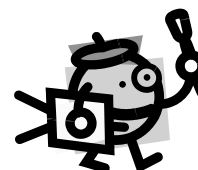
